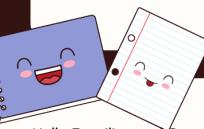


All students are graded on participation, cooperation within groups, and effort to improve.

Music

Music students in grades 3 & 4 are working on how to read basic notes and rhythms. Students in grade 3 will be playing rhythms and beats on small percussion instruments while the 4th graders will begin to use the Boomwhackers to play simple musical rhythms and melodies.

Students in grade 5 are learning to read the notes on the lines and spaces and will begin how to play the Ukulele, a small 4-string instrument.

Students in grade 6 have been reviewing the instruments of the orchestra; strings, brass, woodwinds, and percussion. They have just begun a unit on bucket drumming.





Art

We are continuing to work on balance, repetition, and symmetry in our artwork while using a variety of different materials and techniques. We will begin a few festive projects in December using blending techniques with oil pastels. 4th grade will continue to study the art history timeline touching upon Greek vases, Aztec masks, and medieval castles.



PE

During the 2nd quarter, students will work to gain knowledge and skills to achieve and maintain a health-enhancing level of physical activity and fitness. Physical fitness will be the primary focus in class, including both health-related fitness and skill-related fitness.
