Welcome to 6th Grade! Students are learning about Mixtures and Solutions in Science class. Our first investigation will involve trying to separate mixtures using different methods. We will also investigate the Concepts of Concentration and Saturation. It's sure to be challenging and exciting!

In Social Studies, students learned about Europe through the Five Themes of Geography. Students also chose a country in Europe to learn about through guided research, and then they shared their findings through a Google slides presentation.

In Math class, we are reviewing multiplication facts, number lines, factors and multiples, prime factorization, square numbers and square roots, and cube numbers and cube roots. Our learning activities are designed to help students improve their Number Sense. Students are expected to complete 2.5 hours of IXL math work each week (Monday thru Sunday) that directly tie into our daily lessons.

The classes just finished reading Tuck Everlasting, our first novel this year. They didn't want it to end! Students are learning new vocabulary and writing skills associated with the novel. We plan to show the movie in class on Friday..

This allows us to have accurate records and to ensure that our students are accounted for. We are beginning the process of sending home letters for unexcused absences.



## **Paul School Flu Vaccine Clinic**

The flu vaccine clinic for students is scheduled for Friday, October 20th, 2023 starting at 9:00 am. The clinic is offered through the Carroll County Coalition for Public Health (CCCPH). Your child does not need to get the flu vaccine if you choose not to have them vaccinated, however it is recommended to protect them and those around them.

If you have consented to have your child vaccinated and your child has already been vaccinated for this year, please notify the school nurse so your child's consent form can be withdrawn from the list of students receiving the vaccine. This is an opt-in clinic.

There will be no flu vaccine clinic in the afternoon for those attending the afternoon sessions in Pre-K. If your child attends the afternoon session, please arrange to attend the vaccine clinic in the morning with your child.

This week, your student was sent home with the following three forms:

- Flu vaccine consent form. Please have your child return this to the school nurse by Thursday, 1. October 19th by the end of the school day. Students who do not submit their form to the school nurse are not eligible for the flu vaccine.
- 2. Information regarding the <u>New Hampshire Immunization Information System (NHIIS)</u>. This is a HIPAA compliant vaccine registry that connects and shares immunization information among public clinics, private provider offices, public health departments, schools, hospitals, and other healthcare facilities that administer immunizations. This is a valuable tool for the school nurse to ensure students are compliant with the state-required immunizations. Parents can opt-in at their child's healthcare providers office.
